
NC TODAY

As 2019 comes to a close, North Carolina's economic picture looks similar to what it did at the end of last year – which is pretty good overall. Our economy continues to grow, albeit modestly. The unemployment rate remains low by historical standards and has barely changed from November 2018 when it sat at 3.7%. This continues to be a particularly good environment for workers but creates challenges for employers in need of talent to expand. However, as long as consumer confidence stays strong nationally, economic growth in NC should continue in 2020.

Unemployment Rate Trend




Unemployment Rate Comparison


