


## Unemployment Rate Trend




## Unemployment Rate Comparison






## Total Nonfarm Jobs




## Average Real Weekly Earnings (Private Nonfarm Sector)



## Labor Force Participation Rate




## Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims





## Residential Building Permits




