
## Mitsubishi Minatomirai Industrial Museum

# B. Cultural Tour : Naritasan Shinshoji Temple & Omotesando Avenue

\*Grilled eel is a very popular dish in Japan and one of the specialties of Naritasan. However, if you cannot eat eel, you can substitute it with shrimp or vegetable tempura.

**Naritasan Shinsho-ji Temple** has a history of 1,080 years and is one of Japan's most visited temples, attracting over 10 million worshippers annually. The vast grounds feature nature-filled parks and power spots believed to enhance fortune. Since the Edo period, Narita has been a place of faith that heals the hearts of its visitors.

Part of the reason for Naritasan Shinshoji Temple's enduring popularity is its **striking architecture**, much of which has been designated as Important Cultural Properties of Japan. The new and former Great Main Halls are famous for their scale and intricate carvings, respectively, while the richly decorated three storied pagoda and a huge Tahoto style pagoda, named the Great Pagoda of Peace, are popular and worthwhile attractions.

Beyond the temple lies the 165,000 square meter **Naritasan Park**. A paved path winds through a thickly-forested hill.



## B. Cultural Tour : Naritasan Shinshoji Temple & Omotesando Avenue



**Goma** is a Buddhist ritual where fire is lit and prayers are offered. Practiced in sects like Shingon and Tendai, wishes are written on wooden sticks and burned to invoke deities. The fire symbolizes wisdom and purifies desires. At Naritasan Shinshoji Temple, this ritual has historical significance and is performed to convey believers' wishes to the deities.

**Kabayaki eel** (grilled eel rice bowl) is a must-try: it's healthy, boosts stamina, and has a unique flavor with its crispy, sweet soy sauce exterior and tender inside, served on rice in a lacquered box.

Narita's unagi is incredibly popular, and from the Edo period, travelers enjoyed eel dishes to refresh themselves.



Starting roughly from Narita Station and extending about 800 meters to Narita-san, **Narita-san Omotesando** is a shopping street lined with 150 stores that sell crafts, souvenirs, and mouthwatering cuisine. The area features an engaging balance of traditional and modern shops, making it suitable for a range of visitors.

As you stroll along the scenic route, you will come across clothes, ceramics, wooden items like chopsticks, spoons, and baskets, Japanese pickles, jewelry, and much more! The bustling atmosphere, fueled by the excited chatter of passersby, exchange of wares, and intoxicating food aromas, is contagious.
