Current Employment Statistics (CES)- General Description

 Produces detailed industry estimates of nonfarm employment, hours, and earnings

Based on survey of establishments

Current Employment Statistics (CES)- vis QCEW

- Uses UI tax accounts as sampling frame
- Comes out more frequently
 - CES: National March 2023 State and Local February 2023
 - QCEW 2022 Q3 (July-September)
- Revised annually in March

Current Employment Statistics (CES)- Uses


- As early major economic indicator released each month, can be used in forming policy.
- Input for some data series and employment projections
- Can use for current levels of employment and hours

Current Employment Statistics (CES)- Features

- Monthly
- Doesn't quite use NAICS, but can use equivalents to supersectors and sectors
- State, MSA geographies


NC Leisure & Hospitality Employment

Jan 2018 - Feb 2023, Seasonally Adjusted




COVID Hit Tourism Employment Hard

Leisure & Hospitality % of employment



COVID Hit Tourism Employment Hard


MSA and NC Leisure & Hospitality Employment Growth, Feb 2020 to April 2020


Where has the industry recovered?

Feb 2023, Statewide Data




