# What's up (or down) with layoffs?

Context: the economy is cooling off

- Economy is still growing, but slowing
- Labor market is still tight, but loosening

Recent WARN notices have led to concern about more widespread job losses

 Mar 2023 (Canton paper mill); Aug 2023 (Klaussner Furniture; Mitchell Gold + Bob Williams)

These layoffs, although painful, do not appear to be signaling a broader downturn



## Where are layoffs happening?

Recent high-profile layoffs have been concentrated in NC's manufacturing sector

• Consistent with a nationwide manufacturing slowdown

Nationwide, layoffs have ticked up *slightly* in both "blue-collar" and "white-collar" sectors

Despite this uptick, layoffs remain near a **multi-decade low** nationwide, and **job opportunities** remain relatively **plentiful**

### The upshot Workers still have the upper hand (for now)

It's possible that the economy will **slow further** in the months to come

- Higher interest rates  $\rightarrow$  less investment, slower hiring
- Fewer job openings, more layoffs

#### For now, job openings abound, and employers are reluctant to let go of workers

- Labor market has been surprisingly **resilient**, surviving a trade war, a pandemic, price inflation, high interest rates, and a regional banking crisis
- Jobseekers should try to take advantage of the many opportunities available in our labor market while they're still there for the taking
