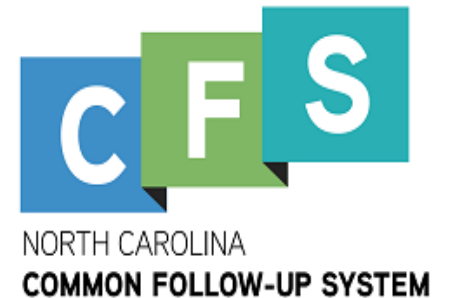

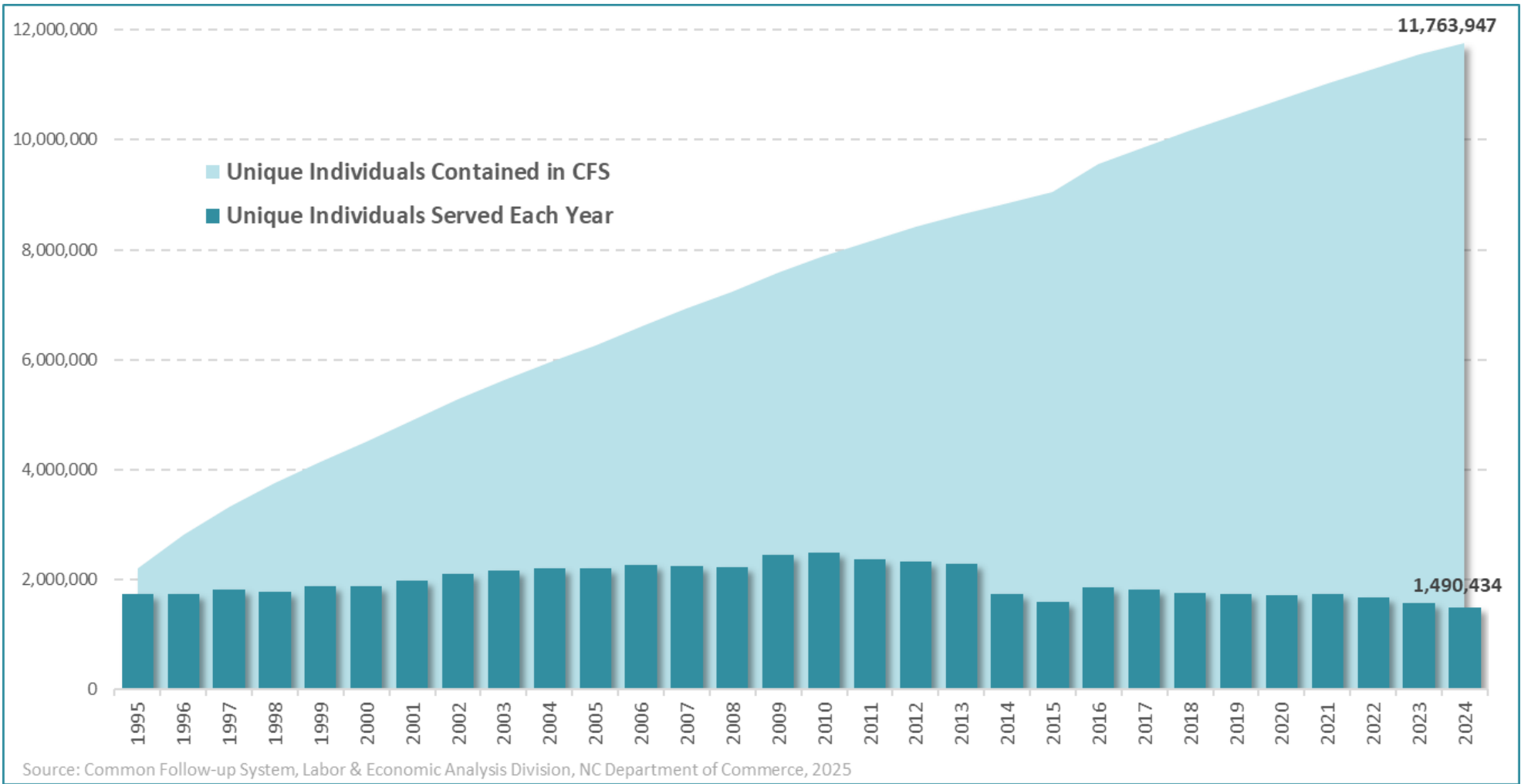

- Further Enrollment in Post-Secondary Education

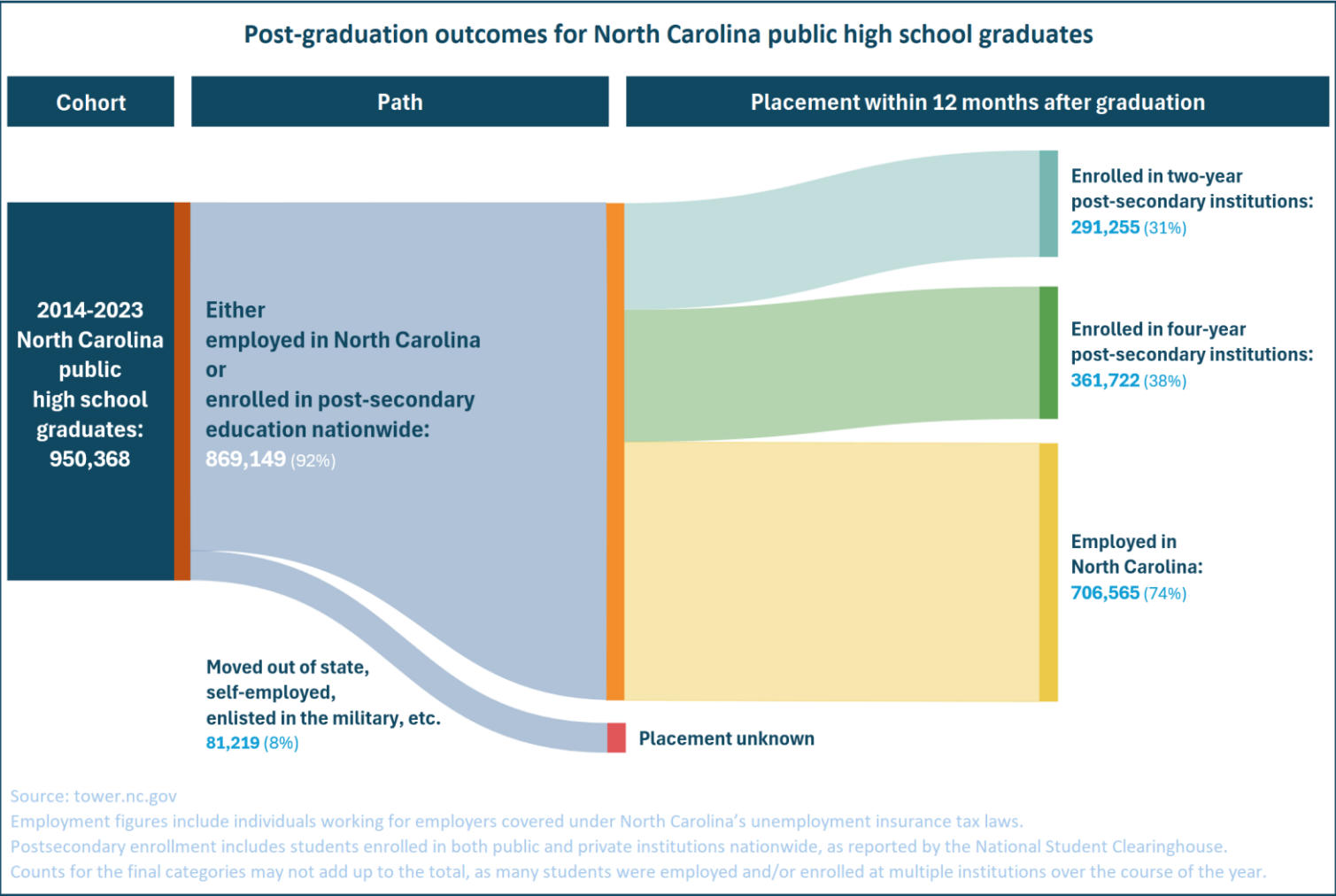
Data can be broken down by:

What Comes After the Cap and Gown?

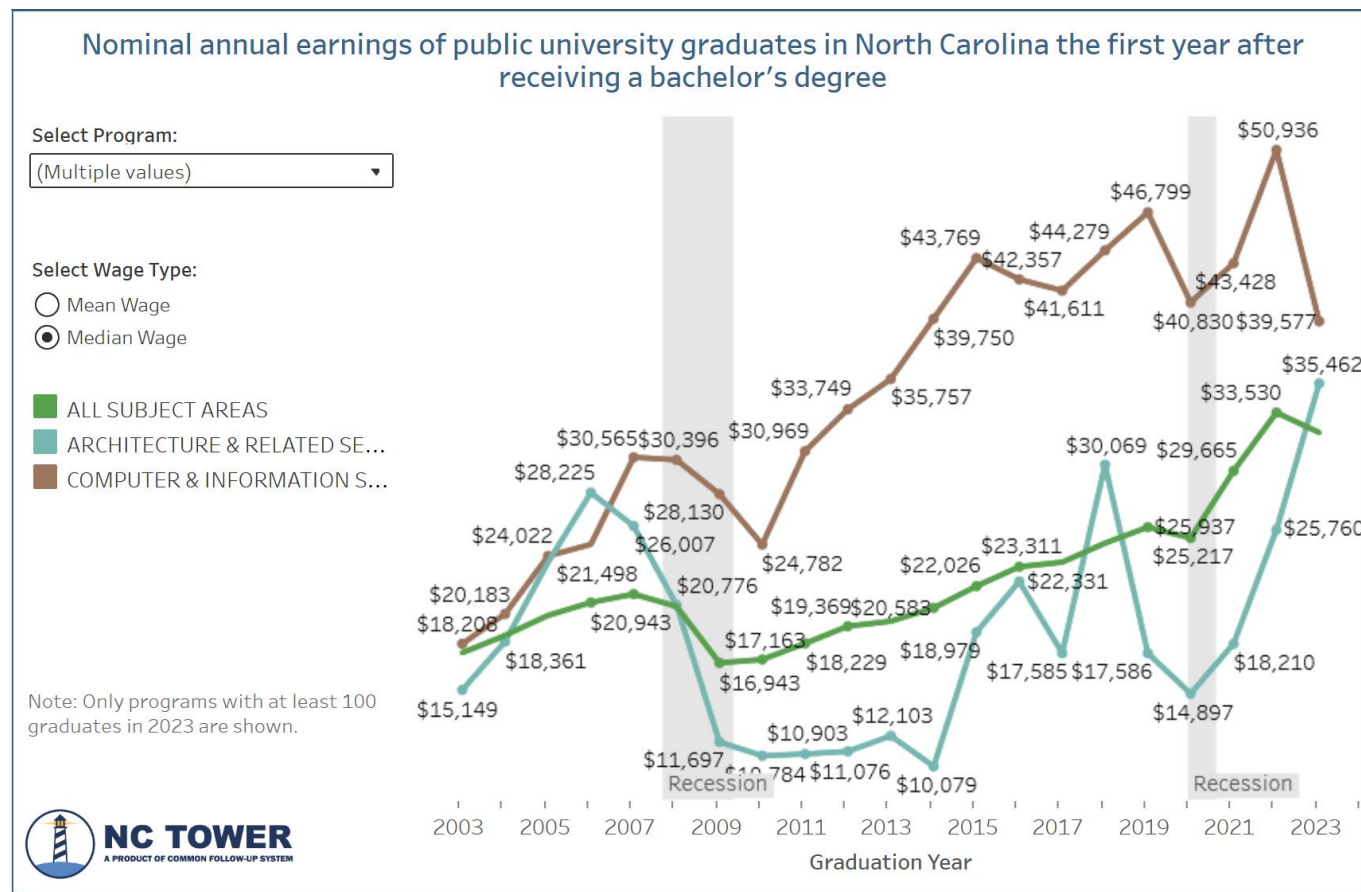
Following graduates of NC public schools (2014–2023) as they move to postsecondary education and the workforce.

The Labor Market for Recent College Graduates

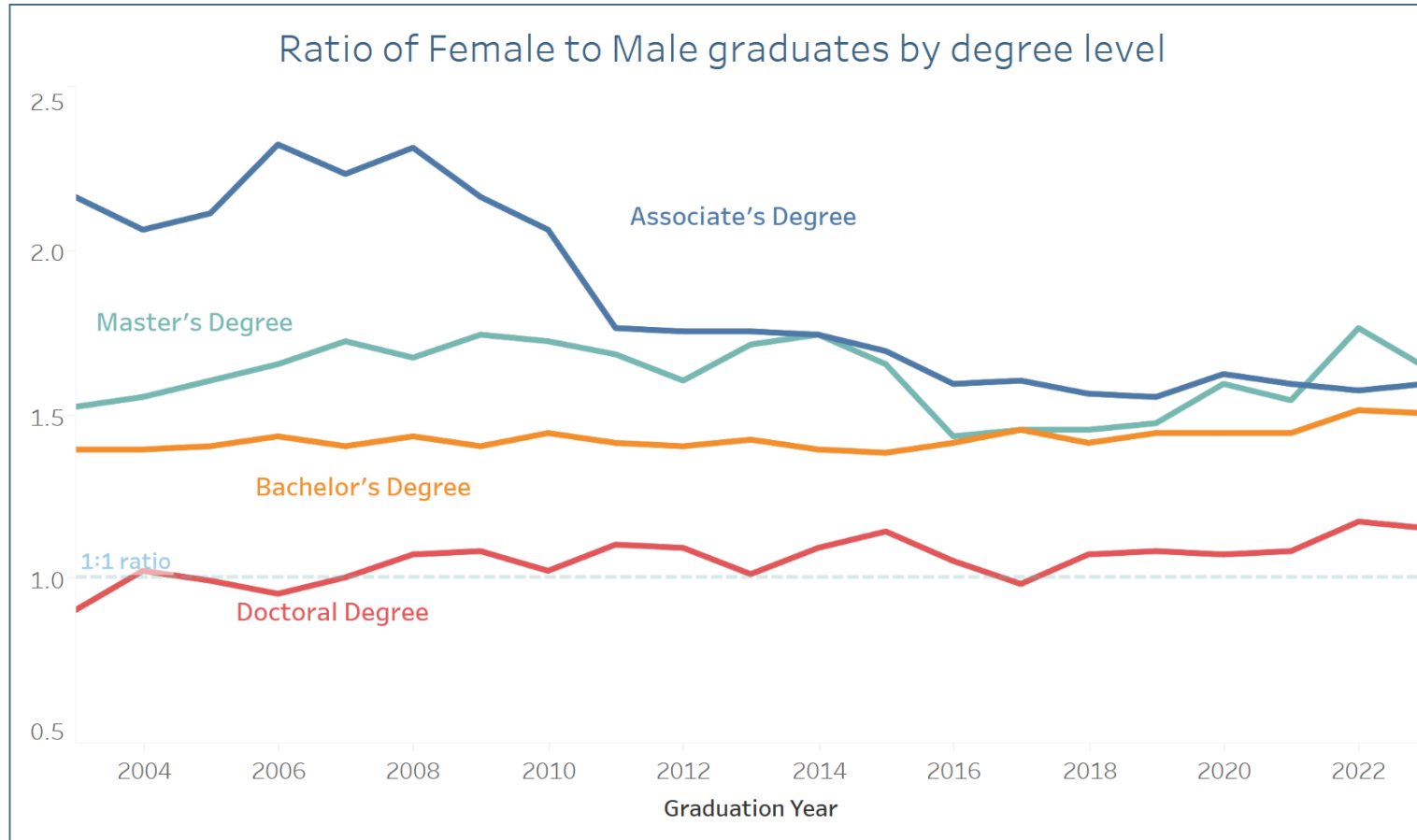
The Class of 2023 experienced a somewhat unexpected decline in first-year post-college wage earnings. Does this trend hold true across all fields of study?

Women Are Winning the Higher Ed Race

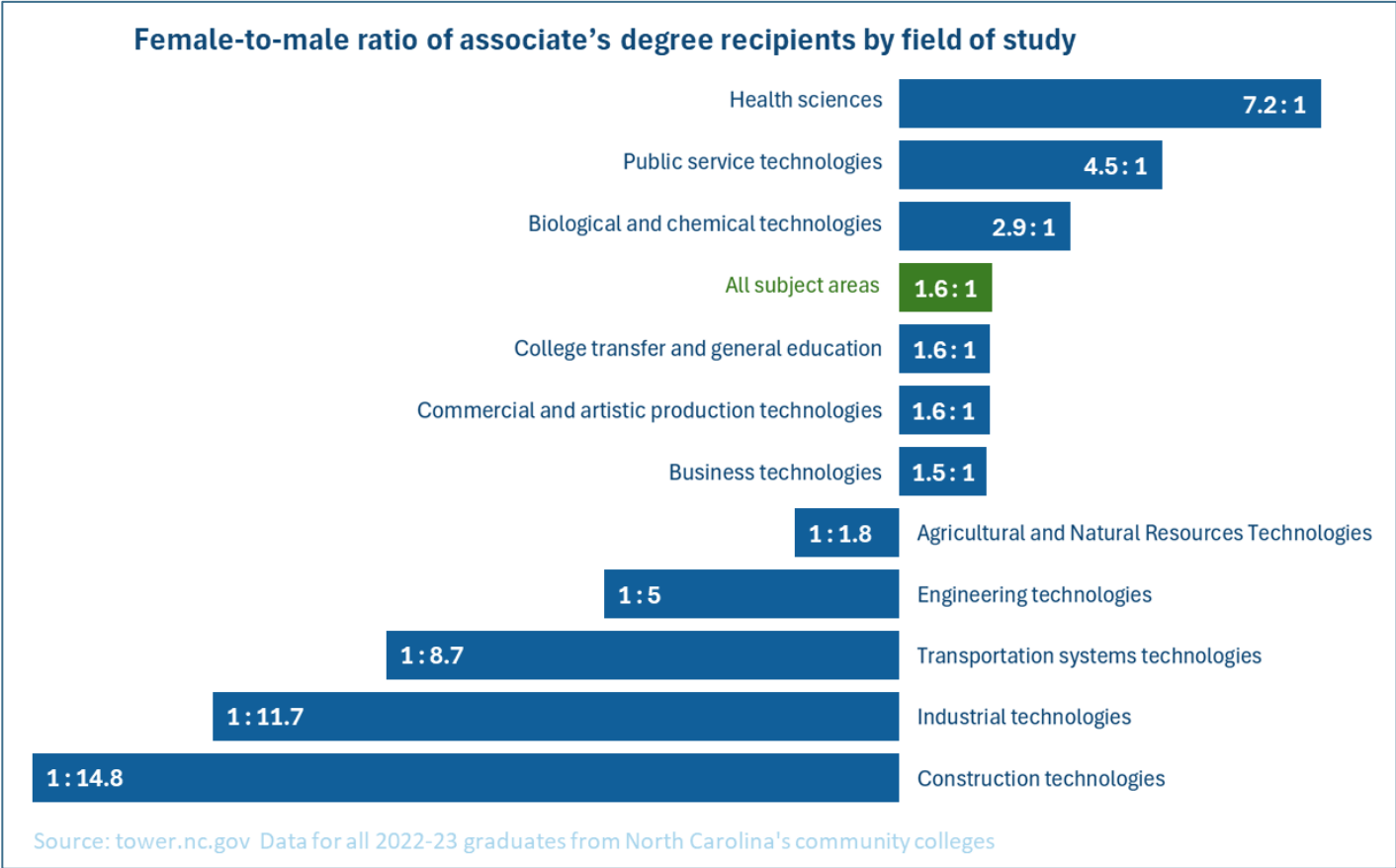
For years, women have been outpacing men in earning college degrees across every level of higher education. But the dynamics are showing signs of shifting.

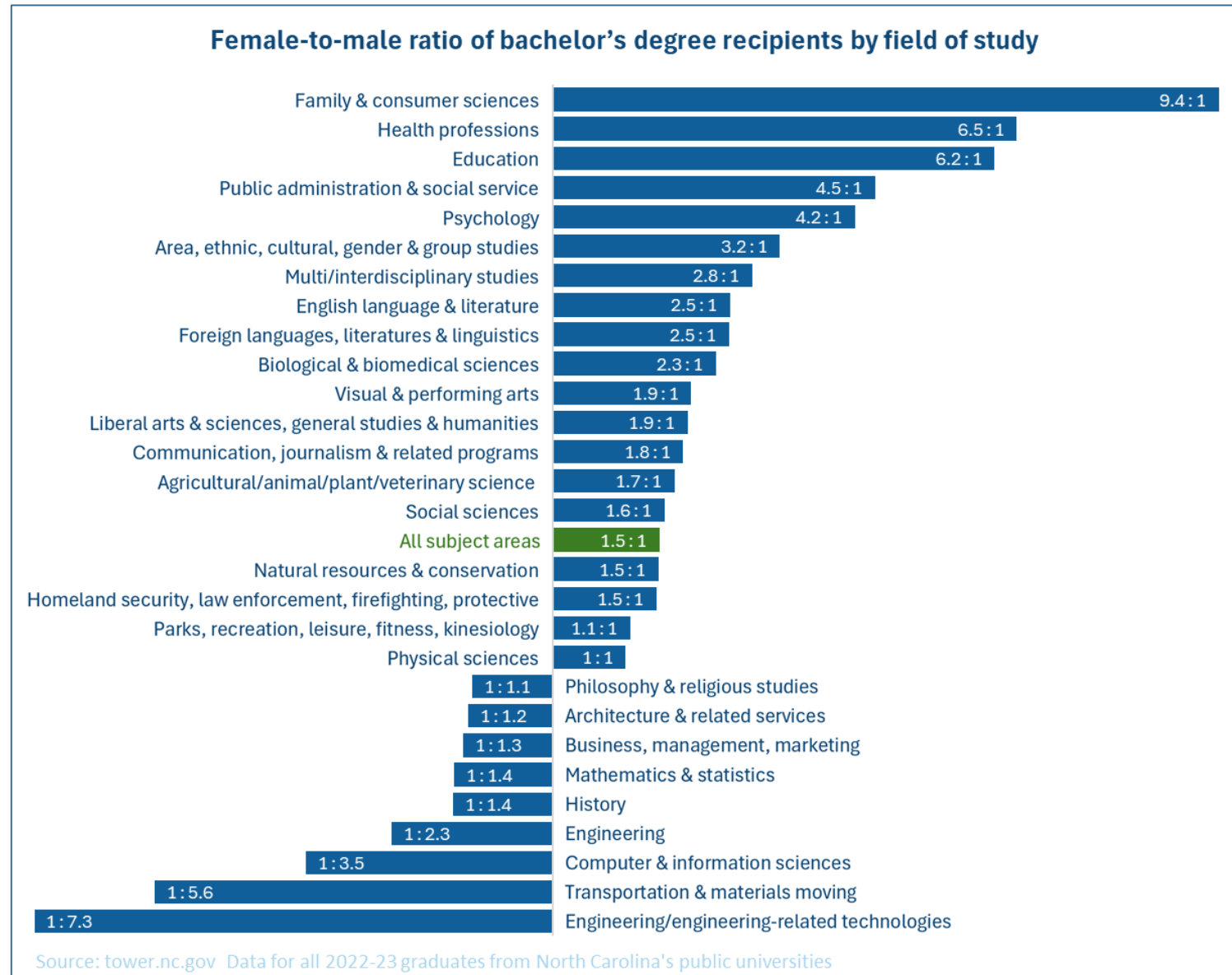
Do College Majors Reinforce the Gender Pay Gap?

By following traditional gender paths into fields like education or engineering, students may unknowingly reinforce the gender pay gap before their careers even begin.



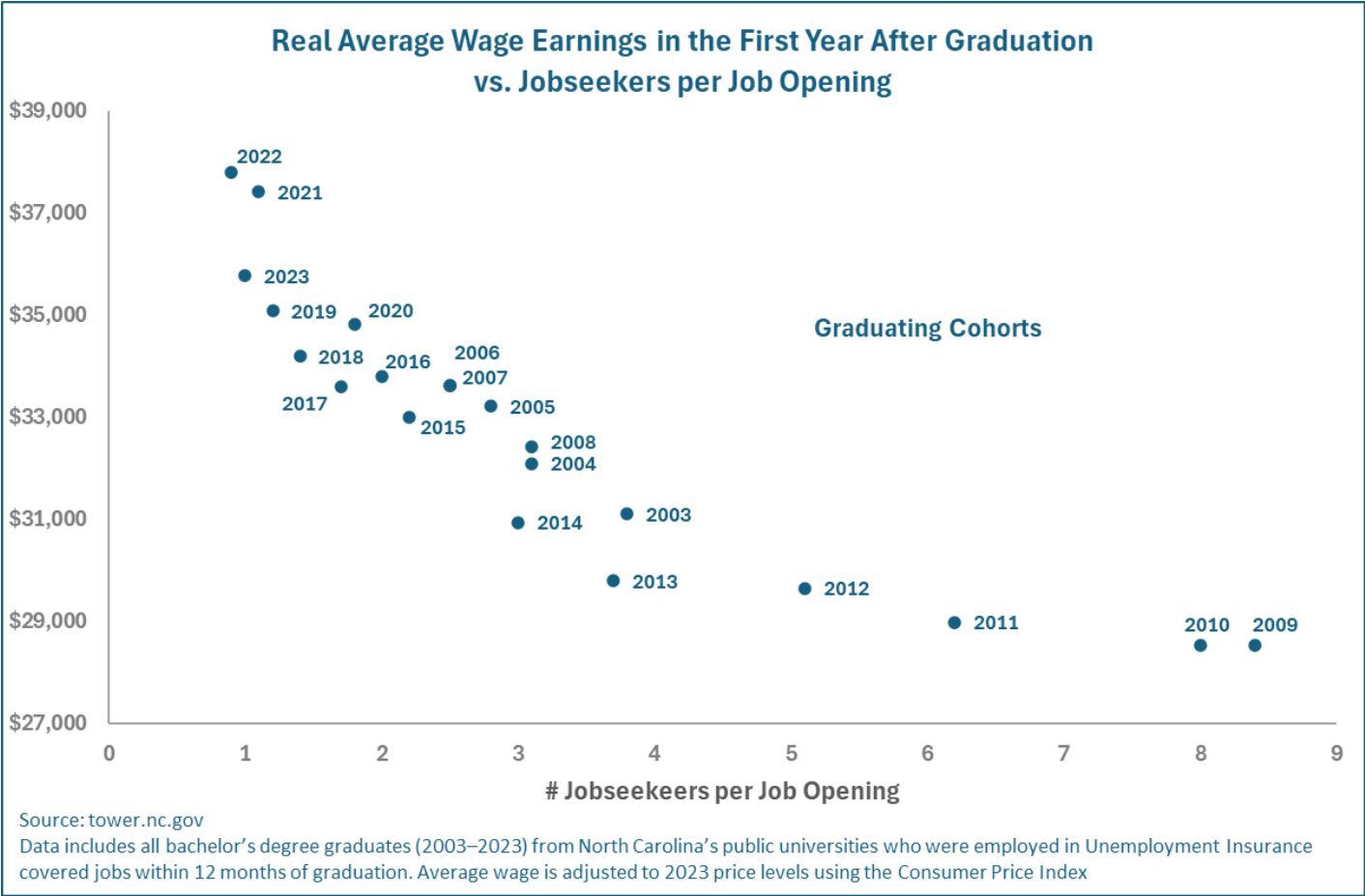

Graduating during a recession can leave more than just a temporary dent in your wallet.

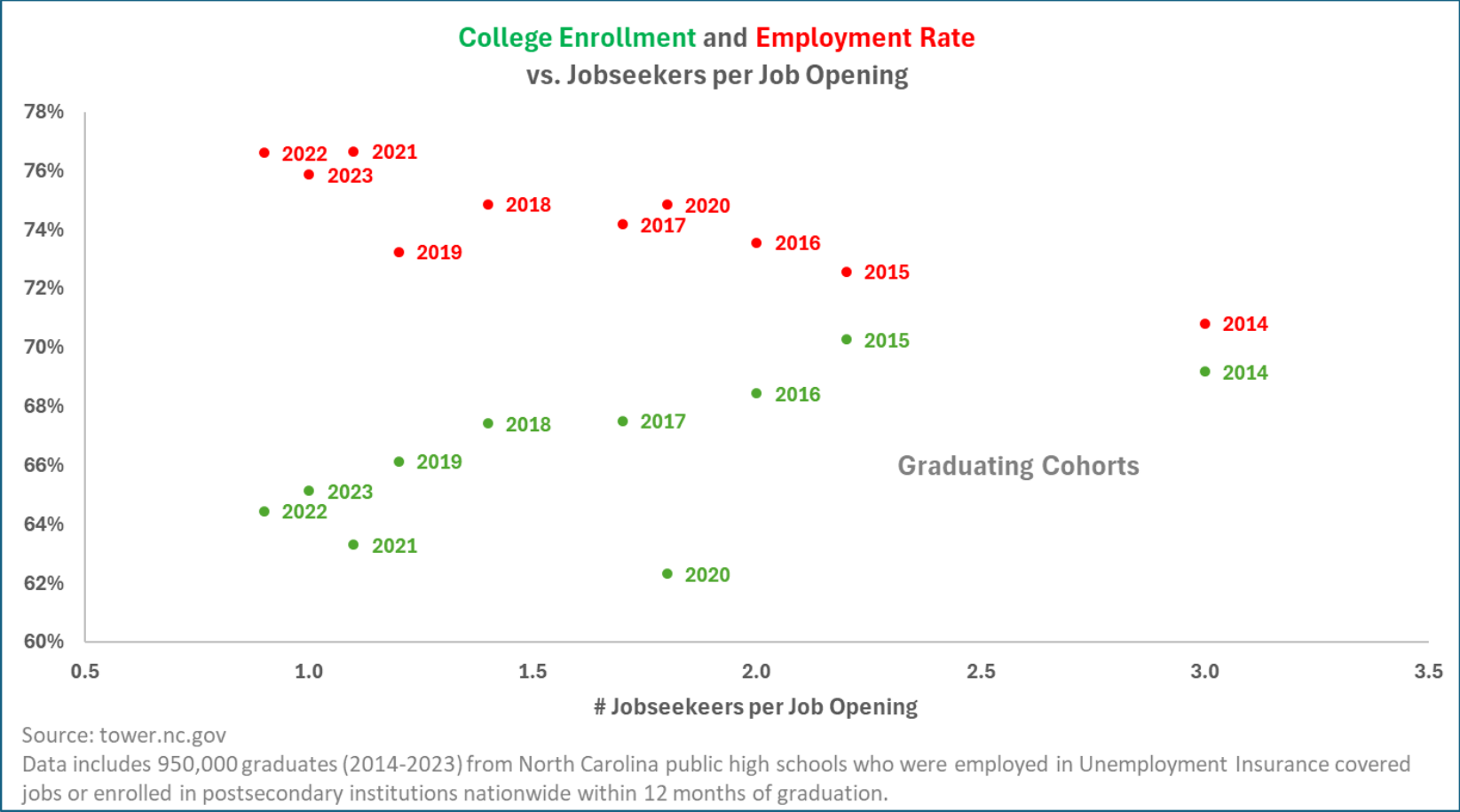

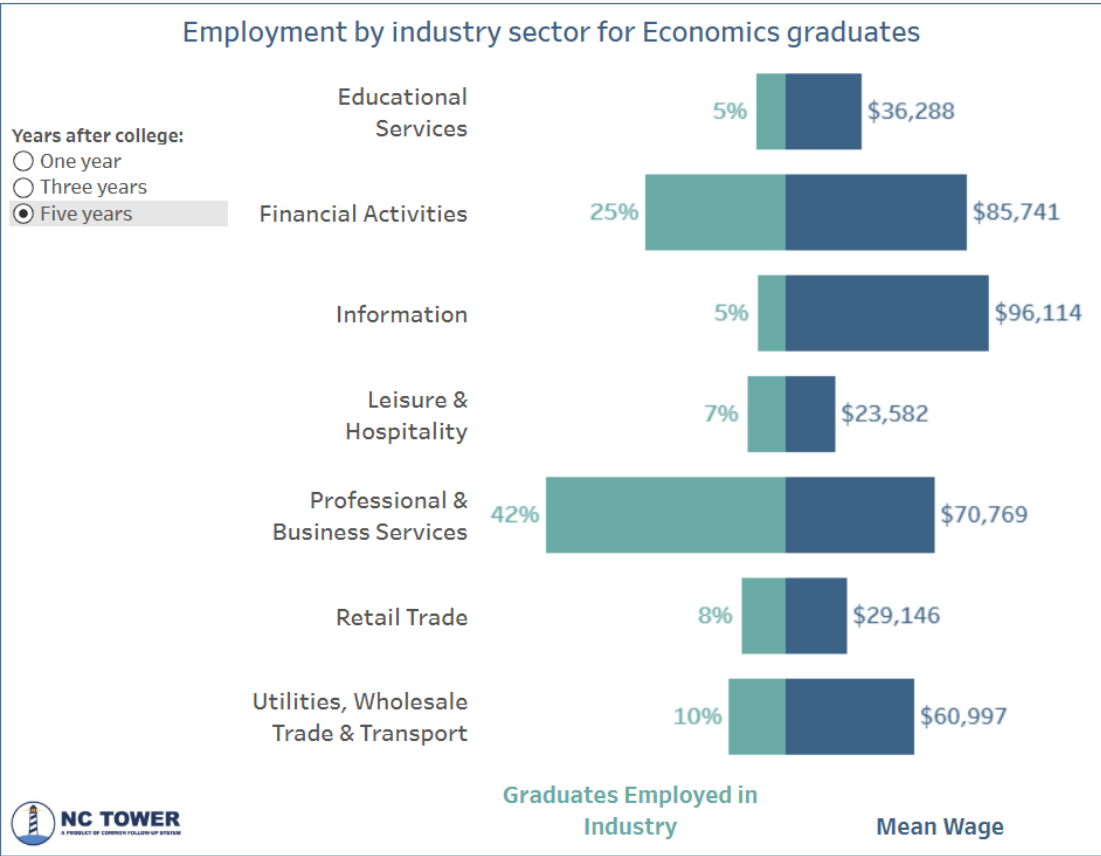
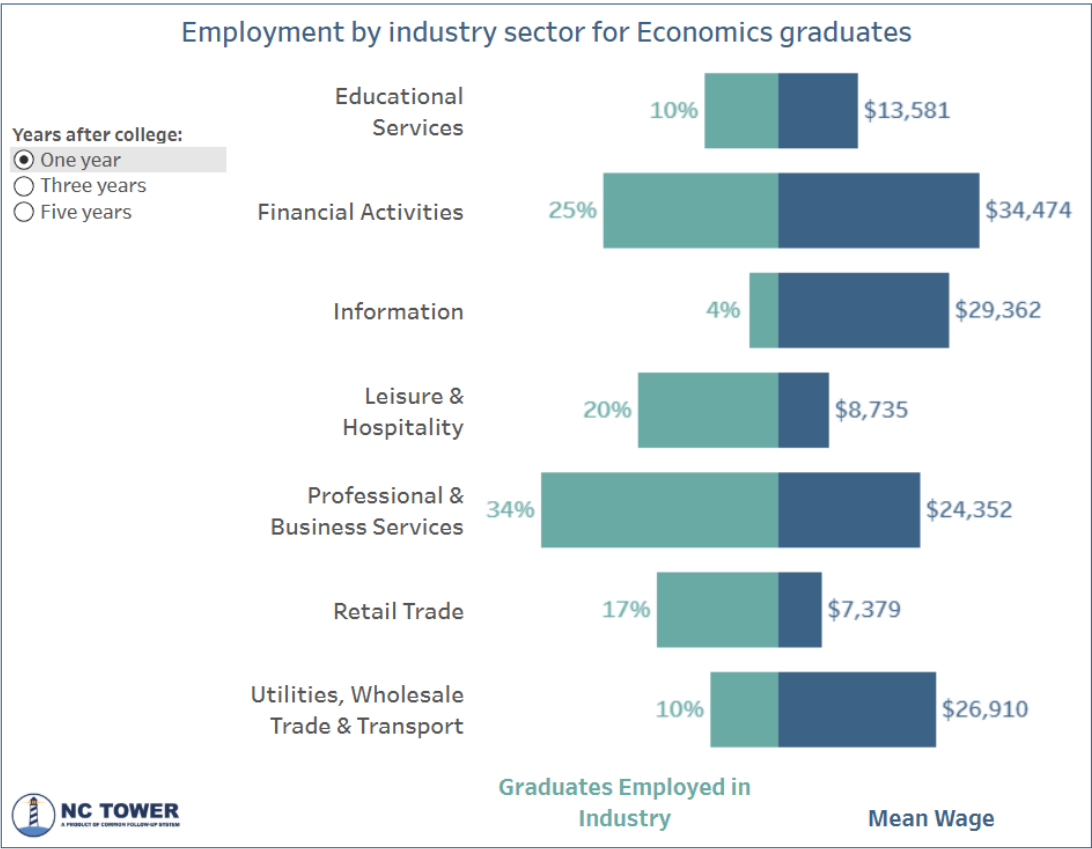
Economic booms increase the opportunity cost of Higher Ed. Why sit in a classroom when you can earn a paycheck right now?

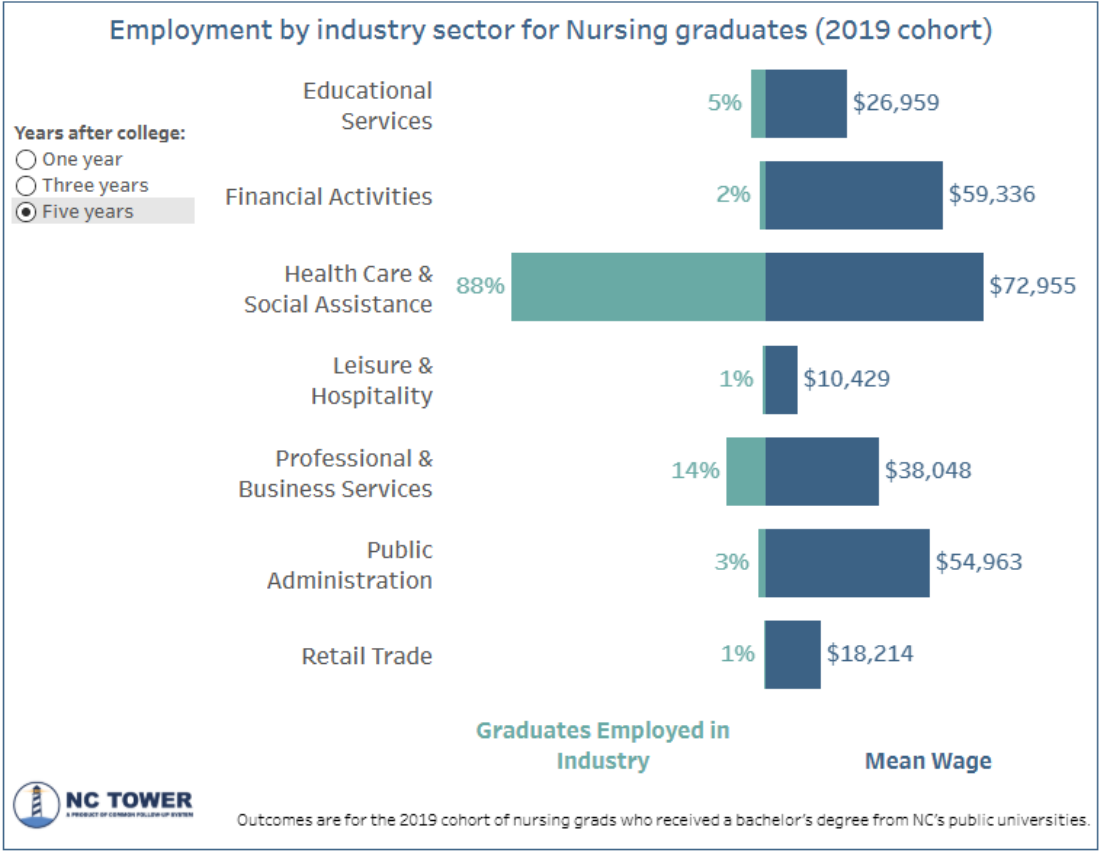
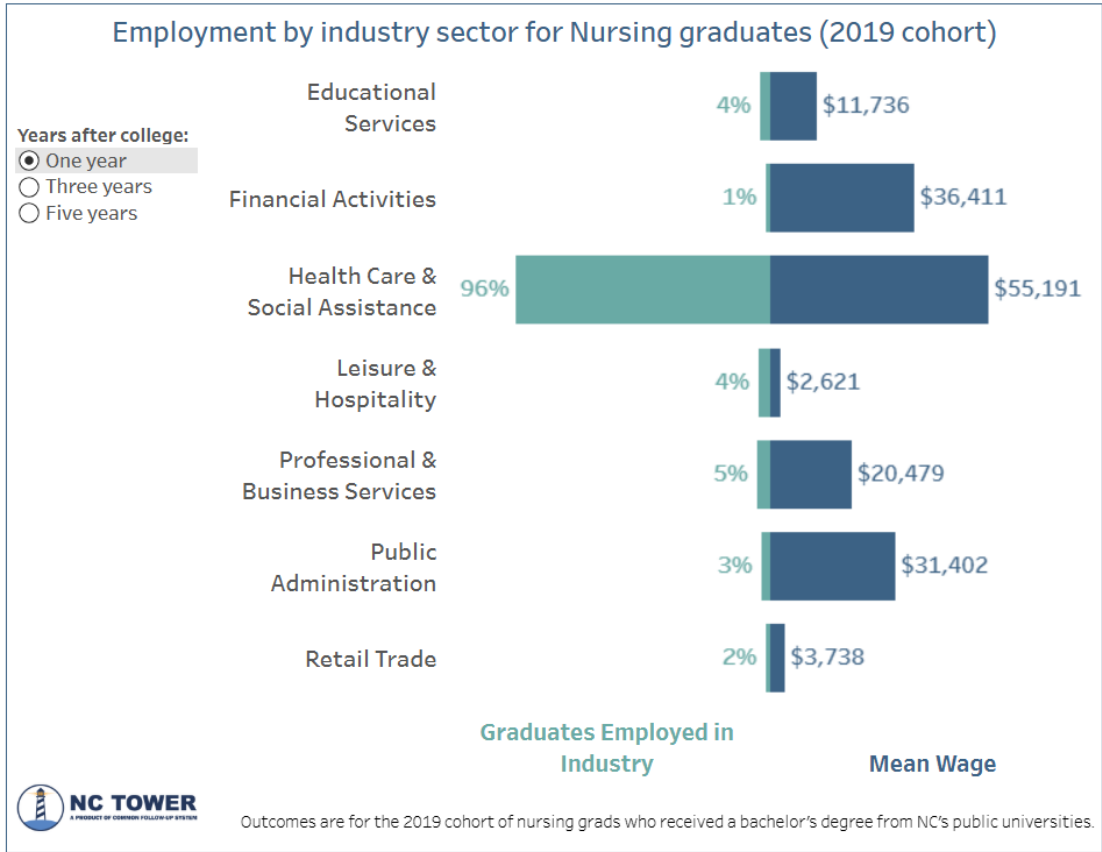
