

# 5 Things Everyone in Workforce & Economic Development Should Know about the Unemployment Rate

## 1. What it is (and isn't):

It's an estimate based on those actively seeking work regardless of UI status.

**Estimate** based on those actively seeking work regardless of UI status

**Estimate** in two ways:

- 1. Based on surveys and models (more on this later).**
- 2. Revised monthly and annually as we get more information.**

# Estimate based on those actively seeking work regardless of UI status

**Unemployed:** jobless, looking for job, available for work

**More than just those who are receiving UI benefits:**

**What about people who have**

- **worked jobs not covered by UI?**
- **exhausted benefits?**
- **entered the labor market for the first time?**
- **re-entered the labor force?**

**Also- we have marginally attached (inc. discouraged workers) measured in labor underutilization at national level**



# LABOR FORCE

Everyone working or actively looking for work

Everyone with at least one job = **Employed**  
(full-time, part-time, perm, temp)

Everyone without a job but actively looking for one = **Unemployed**



Everyone

**not in LABOR FORCE**

Everyone 16 years and older (not in an institution)

# What is the Unemployment Rate?

$$= \frac{\# \text{ Unemployed}}{\text{Total Labor Force}}$$

*in other words...*

$$= \frac{\# \text{ People Not Working but Looking for Work}}{\# \text{ People Employed} + \text{Looking for Work}}$$

# Different geographies mean different calculations


- **National:** Current Population Survey (CPS) (~60,000 households/year)
- **State/Local:** Model-based
  - **State-** signal-plus-noise models from CPS + Current Employment Statistics (CES) and Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims
  - **Local-** Handbook method using Industry Data (CES or Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages (QCEW)) via American Community Survey (ACS) and Population Estimates Program (PEP) plus UI claimants





# It's harder to get local features of it

What if you want things like unemployment rate for:

- **Women** **Use the American Community Survey!!!**
- **Women aged 25-54**
- **Women aged 25-54 with a Bachelor's Degree**
- **American Indian/Alaskan Native (AI/AN) Women aged 25-54 with a Bachelor's Degree**
- **AI/AN Women aged 25-54 with a Bachelor's Degree whose last job was in Finance**
- **AI/AN Women aged 25-54 with a Bachelor's Degree whose last job was in Finance in Charlotte**
