

Supply chain investment truth: Supply chain asset investment follows the marketplace


- Example: global cold-chain storage construction market anticipated growth to \$18.6B by 2027 vs. \$7B in 2019
- Estimated \$500M investment in cold-chain storage, warehousing & logistics in North Carolina
- Offshore Wind Power sector projected to invest \$140B by 2035

- Domestic infrastructure capable of facilitating OSW manufacture and installation
- Innovation, technology and workforce




North Carolina Priority **Highway** Freight Network

NC Priority Highway Freight Network

- Nearly 4,000 miles of Interstate, US and state routes important to freight transport
- Efficient, competitive routes to maritime ports at Morehead City, Wilmington, and Norfolk
- Easy and affordable overweight/oversized permitting process
- NCDOT congestion analysis resources can inform supply chain optimization
- Full catalog of routing limitations for air draft or highway geometry




North Carolina Priority **Highway** Freight Network



North Carolina Priority **Highway** Freight Network

- North Carolina Priority Highway Freight Network routes serve maritime ports
- Includes National Priority Freight Network
- Connects Critical Urban and Rural Freight Networks
- Key connections to interstates I-95, I-40, I-85, and more...
- US and NC state routes provide efficient access with minimal congestion
- Resources for planning include network congestion analysis, key routing to avoid bottlenecks, and geospatial data


North Carolina Ports are strategically positioned within 700 miles of more than 70% of the US industrial base

 Cold Storage; OOG/Project Cargo
- 284 acres, 9 berths with 6,740 ft of wharf frontage including on-dock rail

Port of Morehead City


- Bulk; Breakbulk; Ro/Ro; Cold Storage; OOG/Project Cargo; Barge
- 128 acres, 9 berths with 5,366 ft of wharf frontage including on-dock rail; 150 acres available for development on Radio Island

Port of Wilmington


- 600,000 TEU capacity container terminal; 7 container cranes
- 284 acres, 9 berths with 6,740 ft of wharf frontage including on-dock rail
- More than 1M sq ft of covered and sprinklered storage
- 775+ Reefer plugs on terminal
- 26 miles from the open sea on the Cape Fear River with 42 ft MLLW channel
- Maximum air draft of 212 ft
- Direct connectivity to hinterland via
 I-40, NC Priority Highway Freight Network
- Foreign Trade Zone 214; C-TPAT Certified
- Intermodal rail provided by CSX Transportation



Maritime Supply Chain Assets

Port of Morehead City

- Bulk and Breakbulk port terminal
- 128 acres, 9 berths with 5,366 ft of wharf frontage including on-dock rail
- 150 acres available for development on Radio Island
- More than 1M sq ft of covered storage and 43 acres of open storage area
- 4 miles from the open sea with 45 ft MLLW channel;
 No air draft restrictions
- Direct connectivity to hinterland via US-70; US-17 and NC Priority Highway Freight Network
- Foreign Trade Zone 214; C-TPAT Certified
- Intermodal rail provided by Norfolk Southern






Railroads

NC Priority **Rail** Freight Network

- Nearly 2,110 mi of railroad serving 86 of North Carolina's 100 counties
- Class 1s CSX and Norfolk Southern serve interstate routes with double-stack and dimensional load capacity
- Shortlines operate on-port, regionally, statewide to provide connectivity through transload and intermodal facilities
- Efficient, competitive routes to maritime ports at Morehead City, Wilmington, and Norfolk
- Full catalog of routing limitations for air draft or railroad geometry

North Carolina Priority Rail Freight Network

North Carolina Priority Rail Freight Network routes serve maritime ports, manufacturing, and population centers:

- Class 1 railroads provide efficient connectivity to national network
 - CSX serves Wilmington (NC); VA
 - Norfolk Southern serves Morehead City (NC); VA
- 20+ Shortline railroads provide local and regional service, last-mile
- Rail network includes STRACNET (US Department of Defense's Strategic Rail Corridor)
- Resources for planning includes geospatial network data, performance/reliability, and resiliency analysis





- CSX's Carolina Connector Intermodal Terminal in Rocky Mount (CCX)
- North Carolina Ports' Charlotte Inland Port (CIP)
- CSX Pinoca Intermodal in Charlotte
- Norfolk Southern's Charlotte Intermodal Facility
- Norfolk Southern's Greensboro Intermodal Container Facility
- NC Global TransPark aviation logistics, advanced manufacturing facility and airfield in Kinston (NCGTP)
- 13 active multimodal transload facilities connecting rail, highway, and more
- 20 of 35 active highway/intermodal connection sites on NHS in North Carolina serving freight



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
Inland Supply Chain Assets



Carolina Connector Intermodal Terminal (CCX) in Rocky Mount, NC

- 330-acre facility
- Serves the I-95 corridor
- 3 wide-span, zero-emission electric cranes with a lift capacity of 110,000 containers per year
- Wilmington Midwest Express provides reliable access to Chicago, NW Ohio, and St. Louis






NC Ports' Charlotte Inland Port

- 20-acre facility
- Inland intermodal container facility in Charlotte, NC
- Serves strategic I-85 and I-77 corridors
- Queen City Express (CSX) provides nextday service from Port of Wilmington






CSX Pinoca Intermodal Facility

- 48-acre facility
- Inland intermodal container facility in Charlotte, NC
- Serves strategic I-85 and I-77 corridors



Norfolk Southern Charlotte Intermodal


- 150-acre facility (296 acres fully developed)
- Inland intermodal container facility in Charlotte, NC
- Serves strategic I-85 and I-77 corridors
- Capacity of 250,000 annual cargo lifts
- Site includes loading area, storage yard, inbound and outbound drives, maintenance road, and drop zone



Inland Supply Chain Assets


Greensboro/Triad Intermodal Terminal

- 20-acre facility
- Norfolk Southern Class 1 Rail service
- General service through Port of Virginia
- 2 RTG (rubber-tire gantry cranes); toplift assets
- Significant energy resources nearby (Colonial Pipeline)



North Carolina Global TransPark

- Multimodal industrial park supporting manufacturing and logistics for aviation, aerospace, defense, emergency response and advanced materials industries
- 2,500-acre facility featuring a 11,500 ft runway with more than 5,775 acres of environmentallypermitted land adjacent
- On-site active community college training program with a 33,000 sq ft composite training center




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Inland Supply Chain Assets

Transload Facilities

- North Carolina has 13 active rail-served transload facilities connecting rail and highway freight users
- Transload facilities provide multimodal transport and last-mile logistics solutions
- Materials serviced include:

Construction materials; warehouse merchandise; palletized freight; oversized cargo; vehicle or aerospace components; telecommunication equipment; heavy machinery; specialized freight; hazardous materials; climate-controlled product




Aviation

- NCDOT Aviation investment and strategic planning supports economic development, manufacturing
- 72 publicly-owned airports
- 13 major air cargo-handling companies operating in North Carolina
- 22% growth in air cargo between 2019 and 2021
- Key airports include: Charlotte Douglas Intl.;
 Piedmont Triad Intl.; Raleigh-Durham Intl.; Coastal Carolina Regional, Wilmington Intl.; Rocky Mount/Wilson Regional
- Advanced air mobility including NCDOT's UAS Beyond Program




Top 3 Airports - Air Cargo Activity in NC, 2019








- Manufactured NC database managed by North Carolina Manufacturing Extension Partnership (NCMEP)

- Searchable by map, industrial category, sectors served, alphabetical





Chatham-Siler City Megasite

- 1,400 acres focused on Advanced Manufacturing
- Rail served by Norfolk Southern
- Located on US-421 (Future I-685); 42 mi to Piedmont-Triad Intl. Airport
- Foreign Trade Zone 93



Person County Megasite

- 1,300+ acres with significant large water, electricity service capacity
- 50 miles to Raleigh-Durham International Airport
- Foreign Trade Zone 93



Kingsboro CSX Select Megasite

- 1,961 acres focused on Advanced Manufacturing
- Located adjacent to CSX's Carolina Connector Intermodal Facility
- 17 miles to Rocky Mount-Wilson Airport
- Foreign Trade Zone 214




Mid-Atlantic Industrial Rail Park Megasite

- 1,100 acres with Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment Completed
- 18 mi to Port of Wilmington; 11 mi to Wilmington Intl. Airport
- Rail served by CSX
- Foreign Trade Zone 214



International Logistics Park Megasite


- 1,040 focused on logistics
- 18 mi to Port of Wilmington; 11 mi to Wilmington Intl. Airport
- Rail served by CSX
- Foreign Trade Zone 214



North Carolina's Industrial Ecosystem

Foreign Trade Zones

- Zone #214: Includes the Port of Wilmington, Port of Morehead City and NC Global TransPark. Managed by NCDOT.
- Zone #93 Includes the Research Triangle area including Raleigh, Durham, Sanford, Clayton, and more. Managed by the Triangle-J Council of Governments.
- Zone #230 Includes the Piedmont Triad area including Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Burlington, and more. Managed by the Piedmont Triad Partnership.
- Zone #57 Includes the greater Charlotte metro area and surrounding counties. Managed by the Charlotte Regional Business Alliance.
- Zone #20 Based in Norfolk, Virginia; includes seven Northeastern North Carolina counties. Managed by the Virginia Port Authority.




About FTZs:

Foreign or domestic merchandise may enter an FTZ without a formal customs entry document or payment of customs duties or government excise taxes. If the final product is exported from the United States, no customs duty is levied. If the final product is imported into the U.S., duty and excise taxes are due at the time of transfer from the FTZ and formal entry is made into the United States. Duty is paid on the product itself or its imported parts, whichever is lower. (Source: EDPNC)

North Carolina's Industrial Ecosystem

Economic Tiers in NC

- NC Department of Commerce annually ranks the state's 100 counties based on economic well-being and assigns each a Tier designation
- This Tier system is incorporated into state programs encouraging economic activity in the less prosperous areas of the state
- Job Development and Investment Grant (JDIG) Program:
 - Total awards may be up to 80% of tax withholdings from newly created jobs in Tier 1; 75% in Tiers 2 and 3
 - Companies receive 75% of total award amount in Tier 3 (25% to Utility Account), 90% in Tier 2 (10% to Utility Account); and 100% in Tier 1
 - Annual commitment cap reserves at least \$5 million for bottom 50% of counties by economic distress rank



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


Community Colleges

- 58 community colleges, serving all 100 counties of the state
- Workforce skills for industries including aerospace, automotive, healthcare, life sciences, advanced manufacturing, technology, customer service, and construction trades
- Customized training, career and technical education (CTE); 58 Small Business Centers statewide
- 40% of NC wage earners have received education or training at a NC community college during the last 10 years
- **UNC System**
 - Multi-campus system encompasses 16 universities and the NC School of Science and Mathematics; granting 4-year degrees, as well as graduate degrees
 - 250,000+ students are enrolled across the state
- Private Colleges & Universities
 - 55+ four-year colleges or universities with more than 76,000 undergraduate students enrolled




