Offshore Wind Stakeholder Survey 2022 - Methodology

Stakeholder Engagement – ID and Survey Key Stakeholders

- Survey is not a statistically valid poll, rather is intended to help Taskforce and Outreach & Engagement Subcommittee identify information needs and opportunities to engage with OSW stakeholders
- Identified 700+ individuals and compiled into a master contact list
 - Includes input from taskforce members and subcommittee members/organizations Audubon, EDF,
 SEWC, Commerce, EDPNC
- Survey link e-mailed twice to 700+ individuals on key stakeholder list; also promoted on Commerce social media channels, NC TOWERS webpage, in press release from Gov.
 Cooper's office, and during NC TOWERS Taskforce meetings livestreamed on YouTube; stakeholders also encouraged to share link via e-mail and social media

Offshore Wind Stakeholder Survey 2022 - Overview

- 465 responses received
- Completion rate 100% no "dropouts"
- Top stakeholder groups respondents able to select more than one category
 - Environmental/wildlife advocate 51%
 - Other 49%
 - majority "coastal resident/homeowner/property owner", some "citizen/taxpayer", a few - scientist/university, OSW industry, consultants,
 - Local elected or appointed official municipal, county, or tribal 15%

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Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee (Outreach)

Stakeholder Engagement – Roundtables/Brunswick Open House

- Conducted two pilot small group, roundtable discussions
 - Aug. 3 at ECSU
 - Nov. 15 at Carteret Community College in Morehead City
 - Strong turnout & robust discussion at both (see notes below)
- Key process learnings from pilots
 - Need to provide OSW 101
 - Take questions during presentations to encourage two-way discussion
 - Hold after regular business hours to allow teachers, fisherfolk to attend
- Potential for collaboration with other subcommittees on stakeholder-specific roundtables
- Next event = Open House in Brunswick County in March

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Outreach and Engagement Subcommittee (Outreach)

Stakeholder Engagement – Brunswick Open House

- Responding to feedback in survey 42% of respondents (200 individuals) live in Brunswick Co., two-thirds of those said they would like to attend an OSW discussion in their community
- Event to be held in March
- Working to finalize date & location tentatively planned for Brunswick Community College
- Planning to hold 4 7 p.m. to maximize participation (will provide food)
- Working to have experts from BOEM, UNC-W, NC TOWERS available so attendees can meet experts one-on-one and ask questions in a comfortable environment
- Creating feedback mechanisms so that attendees can submit feedback to Taskforce about event and about OSW. Feedback forms will also a be a way for attendees to submit additional questions to Taskforce.
- Will be reaching out to Taskforce members about participation in open house
