XPO Logistics to Expand in Mecklenburg County

Governor Pat McCrory and North Carolina Commerce Secretary Sharon Decker announced today (March 26) that XPO Logistics, a company that provides freight management, expedited transportation and freight forwarding services, will expand its national operations center in Mecklenburg County. The company plans to create 287 new jobs in North Carolina by the end of 2014 and invest \$688,000 into its Ballantyne Corporate Park location in Charlotte.

<u>Uconda Dunn</u> served as the project developer for the N.C. Department of Commerce.

"XPO Logistics is a great example of the growth and success that many companies are experiencing in North Carolina," said Governor McCrory. "Their expansion is proof of the strong presence of qualified talent and attractive quality of life that characterizes our state."

"We're pleased to expand our workforce in a state that shares our focus on job creation and economic growth," said Chief Operating Officer Sean Fernandez of XPO Logistics. "Our decision to base our national operations center in North Carolina was the right move for our company. The services we're building in Charlotte are supporting the rapid growth of our customer base across North America."

The project was made possible in part by an award to XPO Logistics from the state Job Development Investment Grant (JDIG) program, as voted by the state Economic Investment Committee. Receipt of the award is based on proof of job creation and other performance requirements. <u>Read more</u>.

Commerce Secretary Decker names three senior staff to leadership team

On March 21, N.C. Secretary of Commerce Sharon Decker announced the selection of three members of her leadership team.

Josh Ellis was named the Assistant Secretary for Communications and External Affairs after serving as the department's public information officer. Timothy D. Mayes was named Human Resources Director and Ashley Jones was named the Director of Legislative Affairs.

Ellis will direct the department's public affairs team and be responsible for managing communications in the state's leading economic development agency, including project announcements and media inquiries. Ellis has been with Commerce since 2011 in the role of public information officer. Previously, he served as capitol reporter with Curtis Media Group in Raleigh. Ellis is an honors graduate of UNC-Chapel Hill with a bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communications.

On March 20, Governor Pat McCrory and N.C. Commerce Secretary Sharon Decker announced that Meherrin River Forest Products, a lumber processor, will locate its operations in Halifax County. The company plans to create 40 jobs and invest more than \$1.8 million over the next three years in Weldon.

The N.C. Department of Commerce's <u>Tim Ivey</u> was the developer on this project.

Meherrin River Forest Products is a producer of hardwood lumber. The company currently operates a production facility in Alberta, Va., about 50 miles from Weldon. Meherrin River plans to acquire and repair the sawmill facility that was once the headquarters for Coastal Lumber.

The project was made possible in part by a performancebased grant from the <u>One North Carolina Fund</u> of up to \$80,000. The grant is contingent upon proof of job creation and receipt of a local funding match. The One NC Fund provides financial assistance, through local governments, to attract business projects that will stimulate economic activity and create new jobs in the state. Companies receive no money up front and must meet job creation and investment performance standards to qualify for grant funds.

Other partners that helped with this project include: N.C. Community Colleges, Halifax County, Town of Weldon, and the Halifax County Economic Development Commission. <u>Read</u> <u>more</u>.



VisitNC.com sets record pace

Consumer interest and use of the travel planning website <u>VisitNC.com</u>, managed by the N.C. Department of Commerce's Division of Tourism, Film and Sports Development, continue to grow at a record pace. Through policy on all issues relating to human resources. She was also federal liaison for the N.C. Department of Agriculture. Jones is a graduate of Meredith College with a bachelor's degree in history.

State promotes travel to N.C. in Germany

International Marketing Manager Heidi Walters of the N.C. Department of Commerce's Division of Tourism, Film and Sports Development met with 12 key European tour operators in one-to-one meetings to promote North Carolina fly/drive tours, hotels and attractions at the world's largest tourism show, <u>ITB Berlin</u>, in Germany March 6-9. The majority of German, Swiss and Austrian travelers still use tour operators and travel agents for their long haul travel plans.

All tour operators reported that not only are bookings up over last year, North Carolina bookings are exceeding the national average. In addition, Walters met with seven travel trade journalists pitching new stories for the upcoming peak travel season. In 2011 North Carolina welcomed 75,480 visitors from German-speaking Europe, spending more than \$31 million in the state.
