Lenovo to open computer manufacturing line in N.C.

Governor Bev Perdue and Lenovo, the world's second-largest personal computer vendor, announced today (Oct. 2) the company will build a U.S. personal computer manufacturing line in Whitsett, near Greensboro. The announcement defies a trend that has seen electronics manufacturing jobs migrate overseas for more than two decades. As part of the expansion, Lenovo will create 115 new manufacturing jobs where workers will build both Think-branded notebook and desktop PCs for sale to domestic business, government and education customers, as well as consumers. Senator Richard Burr, U.S. Representatives Renee Ellmers and David Price, Lenovo North America President David Schmoock and Vice President and General Manager Tom Looney, and N.C. Department of Commerce Secretary Keith Crisco were also at the press conference.

The new U.S. PC manufacturing line currently is under construction and will open in early 2013. It will reside within Lenovo's recently expanded, 240,000-square-foot U.S. distribution center in Whitsett. Hiring for the manufacturing and related positions will begin later this year.

The U.S. manufacturing line will be capable of turning out

Semprius holds grand opening in Henderson

Solar power innovator Semprius held a grand opening Sept. 26 for its new pilot production plant in Henderson. The project was made possible in part by state grants from the [Job Development Investment Grant](#) and [One North Carolina Grant](#) programs. To meet the targets established in these performance-based grants, the company plans to create 256 jobs over five years and make a capital investment of \$89.7 million in Henderson. The N.C. Department of Commerce's [Bernard Torain](#) was the original developer on this project.

During the grand opening event, local elected officials and economic development leaders were recognized by Semprius CEO Joe Carr, Governor Bev Perdue and N.C. Representative Jim Crawford. This included retired Henderson-Vance Chamber Executive Bill Edwards and Research Triangle Regional Partnership CEO Charles Hayes. Sentinel data centers to develop N.C.'s first mega-scale, multi-tenant data center for enterprise users

Governor Bev Perdue announced today that Sentinel Data Centers LLC, a pioneer in the wholesale data center industry, has selected North Carolina as the location for a 420,000 square foot facility in Durham, making it the region's first purpose-built multi-tenant data center for large-footprint users. The Sentinel NC-1 facility will be available for occupancy in early 2013 upon completion and commissioning of an initial 120,000-square-foot phase.

The Sentinel NC-1 facility will ultimately yield approximately 200,000 square feet of net computer room space, divisible into autonomous, turnkey suites of multiple sizes and configurations. The NC-1 facility will continue to advance the quality, flexibility and energy efficiency standards that have come to define Sentinel's model. Sentinel NC-1 will also offer new "Multi-Tiering" solutions that will enable each user to deploy different resiliency zones within its space, allowing for the granular optimization of cost structure by application. jobs with the potential of 250 in the near future. The company expects to fill up to 45 of the new positions soon, with training beginning the week of Oct. 8. The new jobs will be primarily for inside licensed life and health insurance agents. Compensation for licensed agents will begin at \$14 an hour and, upon 60 days of satisfactory employment, will increase to \$16 an hour. Company officials say that with the program compensation history that will be in place in Charlotte, agents could earn up to \$100,000 annually. The N.C. Department of Commerce's [Ron Leitch](#) was the developer on this project.

A wholly-owned subsidiary of TRANZACT (Fort Lee, N.J.), TZ Insurance Solutions LLC currently employs more than 450 licensed insurance agents. Employee benefits include health, dental, vision, life and short-term disability insurance, a 401(k) plan, and a competitive wage plan with an attractive bonus structure. Training for the new agents will be done by the N.C. Community College System.

Plate fabricator breaks ground on new facility in Pikeville

Joseph T. Ryerson & Son Inc. broke ground on Sept. 26 for its facility expansion in Wayne County. The new facility will be a 45,000-square-foot warehouse with 1,100 square feet of office space, which brings the overall Ryerson footprint in Wayne County to 90,000 square feet. This expansion follows the announcement made on April 16 from Governor Bev Perdue's office stating that Ryerson will expand its operations in Pikeville by moving into a second building and growing its plate fabrication capabilities. The significant investment in additional plate fabrication equipment includes two plasma cutting machines, a laser cutting machine, a plate burning & drilling combination machine, a press brake and a shot blast machine.

N.C.-filmed 'Homeland' wins six Emmys

The North Carolina-filmed series "Homeland" walked away with a total of six awards following the conclusion of the 64th annual Primetime Emmy Awards in Los Angeles on Sept. 23. The series, which was nominated for a total of nine honors, won the evening's top honor by taking home the Outstanding Drama Series. In his acceptance speech, Executive Producer Alex Gansa recognized the Charlotte crew for its work on the series. Claire Danes and Damian Lewis were both named Outstanding Leads in a Drama Series and the writing team won Outstanding Writing for a Drama Series for the show's pilot episode. Earlier, on Sept. 15, the series picked up Emmys for Casting and Single Camera Editing at the Creative Arts Emmy Awards. The casting honor was a special highlight for the state as long-time North Carolina crew members Craig and Lisa Mae Fincannon are part of the show's casting team.

Filming for the first season, including the show's pilot, is estimated to have resulted in a direct in-state spend in excess of \$42 million while providing more than 4,200 job opportunities, including 150 well-paying crew positions for the state's highly-skilled film professionals. The show was heavily courted by the state through the [N.C. Film Office](#) and ultimately chose to shoot in North Carolina as a result of the state's well-trained crew base, the ability to double for Washington, D.C. and its surrounding suburbs, and the state's tax incentive for filming.

This increase in plate fabrication capacity will lead to increased job growth for Wayne County. In addition, the average wage for these new jobs will exceed the average salary in Wayne County. Wake Tech holds foreign military sales training

The N.C. Military Business Center and Invest in Cornwall hosted the ITAR Training Event: Sales to Foreign Militaries on Sept. 27 at Wake Tech Community College in Raleigh. About 60 companies attended.

Foreign military markets represent new opportunities for North Carolina businesses. This training event provided information to assist businesses in understanding the U.S. International Traffic in Arms Regulations, which govern the export of defense products and services from U.S. shores. The training also addressed import regulations in the United Kingdom, which govern U.S. and other foreign sales to the U.K. Ministry of Defense. North Carolina businesses interested in selling to foreign militaries must become knowledgeable in both U.S. export regulations and applicable target county import regulations to leverage these lucrative market opportunities.
