Crisco participates in Baldor media mission

On Dec. 6, N.C. Department of Commerce Secretary Keith Crisco spoke to more than 40 invited trade journalists during a media mission at the Baldor Electric Co. facility in Shelby. Baldor, an advanced manufacturing company, makes large industrial electric motors for a variety of industrial applications.

The company has had a presence in Cleveland County since 1983. Besides Shelby, Baldor also has facilities in Asheville, Huntersville, Kings Mountain, and Marion. Baldor has operations throughout the United States, Canada, England, Mexico and China.

With a significant investment from ABB, which acquired Baldor in 2010, Baldor opened the 259,000-square-foot Shelby facility in a renovated factory. Baldor began producing large directcurrent motors there this past June. It is the new home for ABB's DMI DC product line and will serve as the global center of excellence for DC motor production.

Energy Office attends White House briefing

N.C. Department of Commerce Deputy Secretary and COO Dale Carroll, along with Energy Office Director Ward Lenz and Energy Manager Renee Hutcheson, were in Washington, D.C., Dec. 6 for a White House briefing on the status of the Better Buildings Challenge, a national Department of Energy program that North Carolina is taking part in. The goal of the program is to document energy efficiency. North Carolina is one of four states joining the challenge, including Delaware, Maryland and Massachusetts.

The challenge recognizes North Carolina's efforts, particularly through the Utility Savings Initiative, to make government buildings more energy efficient. The sessions took place in the Eisenhower Executive Office Building and featured briefings on the first-year program accomplishments as well as emerging issues and new challenges.

Below are year-to-date metrics tracked by the N.C. Department of Commerce's Division of Business and Industry Development that illustrate some of the recent activities of the Division. The metrics include the number of new economic development projects assigned to B&I development staff; the number of economic development project announcements; the number of announced jobs created and capital invested; the number of interactions existing industry staff had with businesses throughout the state; and the

Asheville-Buncombe Technical Community College has announced the creation of The Craft Beverage Institute of the Southeast, a premier education destination to meet the needs of the rapidly-growing beverage industry in the region.

"The job of the community college is to find the local need and fill it. Each region has its own market niche," said A-B Tech President Dr. Hank Dunn. "Craft beverages are a big business in the area. We think it will be an incredible boon to the area and will grow exponentially."

The college plans to offer a two-year degree starting in fall 2013 in brewing, distillation and fermentation to teach the science and technical art of craft beverages. A large component of the process will require STEM education. There will also be a business track to address marketing, events and tasting room management to provide a comprehensive education to support the beverage industry.

In addition to A-B Tech's Craft Beverage Institute, Blue Ridge Community College's Continuing Education program has announced a January launch of its Craft Beer Academy and the Oskar Blues Brew School, a collaborative course with Oskar Blues Brewery in Brevard. Read more.
